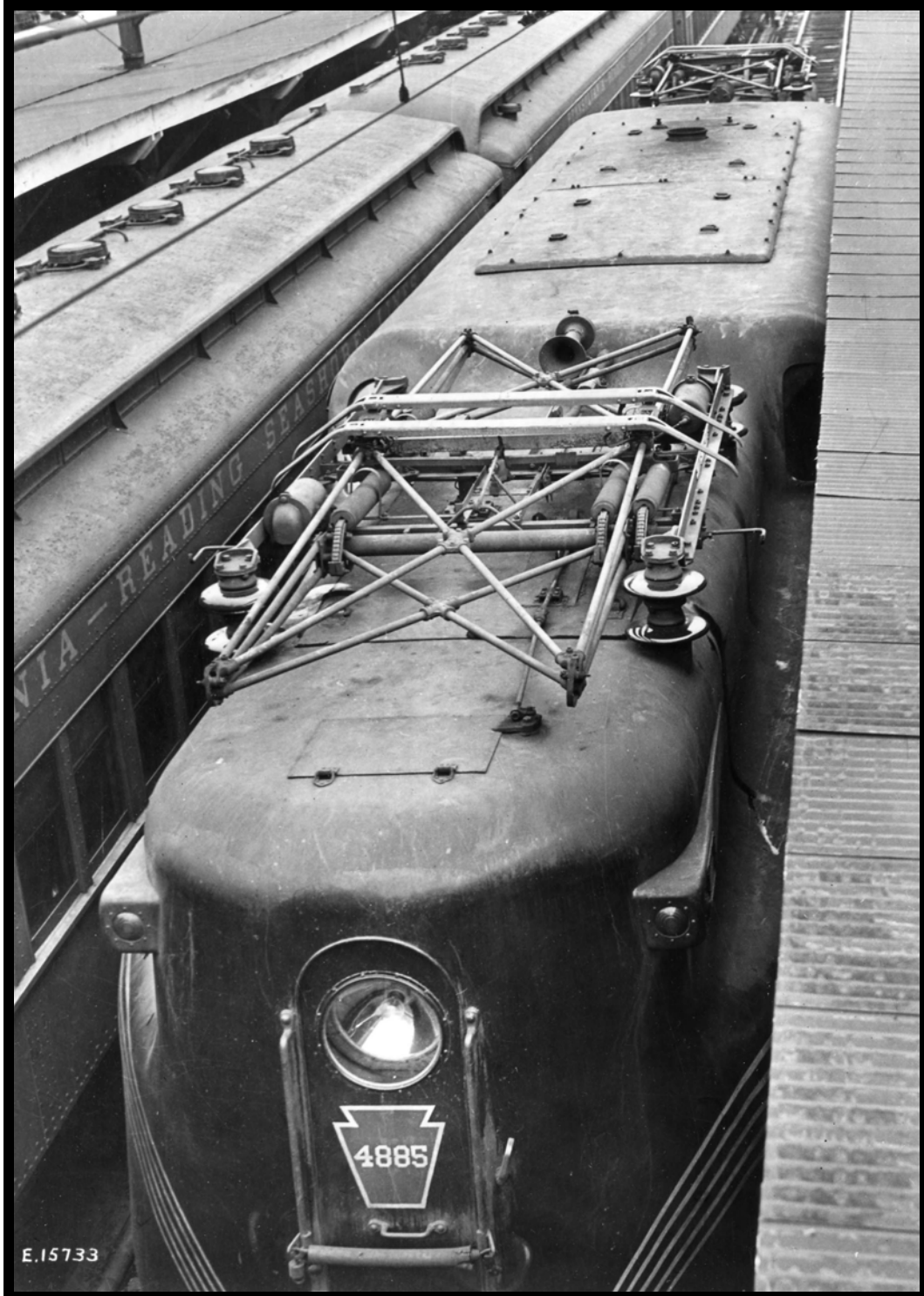

Chuck Blardone

Chuck has been a member of the PRRT&HS since 1976 and Editor of *The Keystone* and PRRT&HS books since 1984. Co-author of *The PRR in Cincinnati* and *PRR Passenger Car Painting and Lettering* book and author of numerous *Keystone* articles, including the *Airway Limited*, RPO cars and a series on Pennsy diners. A PRRT&HS Director for several terms, including the last nine years. His interests include: modeling (narrow gauge), travel, furniture making, photography, writing, English sports cars, gardening and music. Chuck is retired from a career in engineering.

Robert D. Brubaker
